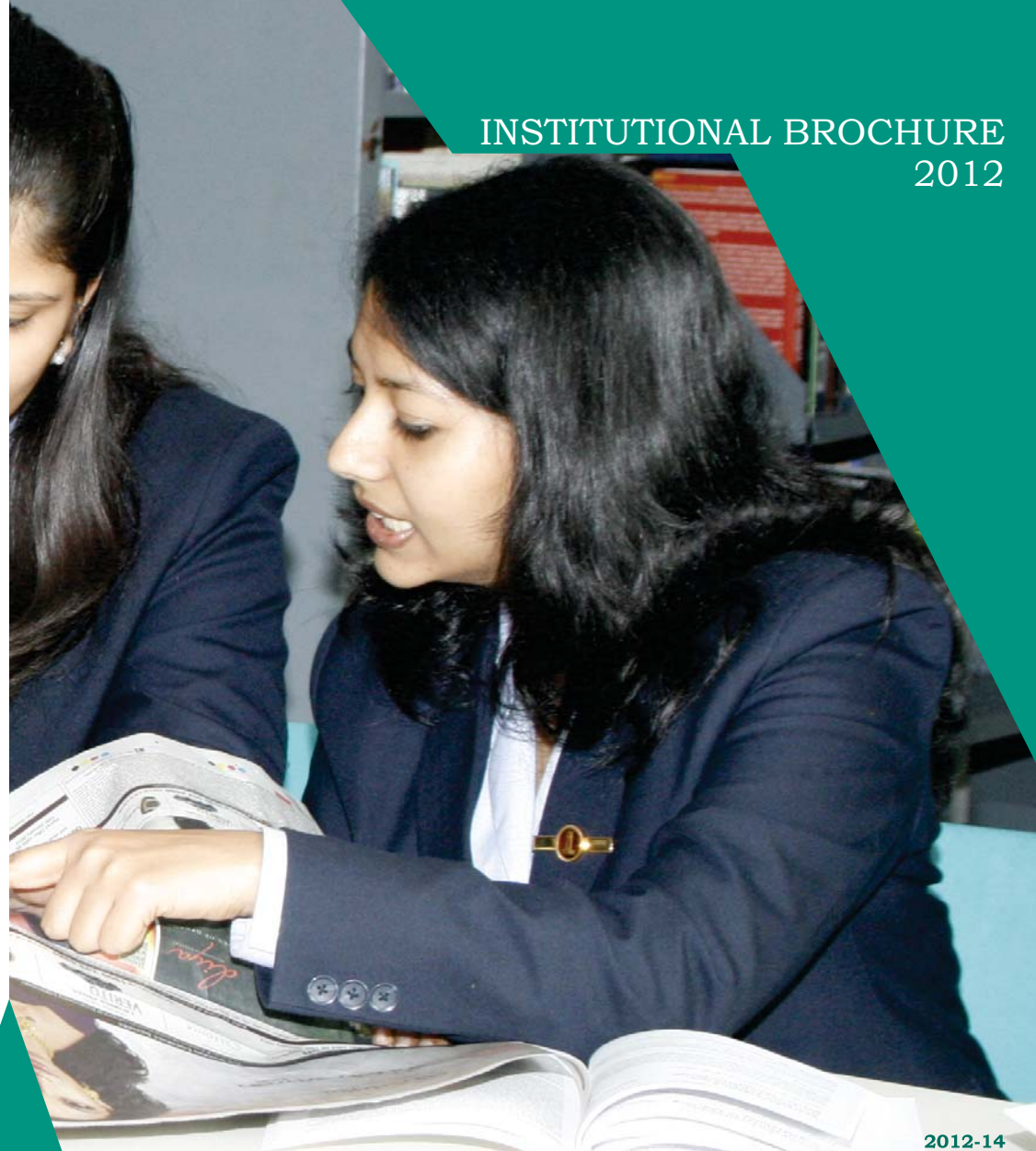

Our Mission

International Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR) is an institution dedicated to the improvement in the standards of health through better management of health care and related programmes. It seeks to accomplish this through management, research, training, consultation and institutional networking in a national and global perspective.

The Institute

International Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR), New Delhi was established on August 18, 2008 under the Indian Institute of Health Management Research Society registered under Societies Registration Act. The first IHMR was established in Jaipur to cater to the growing need for quality healthcare in the country and is rated as No. 1 Healthcare Management Institute as per "OUTLOOK" survey published in 2008.

The Society has established similar Institutes with a focus on national and international healthcare management at New Delhi, Bengaluru and Kolkata. IIHMR has been playing a major role in promoting and conducting research, policy analysis and formulation, strategy development, effective implementation of policies as well as of healthcare programmes to achieve its goal.

IIHMR, New Delhi offers a two-year full-time All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) accredited Postgraduate Programme with specialisation in Hospital Management, Health Management and Healthcare IT Management.





The Campus

The aesthetically designed and elegantly built campus of IIHMR is located at Dwarka, New Delhi. The state-of-the-art infrastructure facilities are designed to meet all academic and administrative requirements and are at par with the international standards. The classrooms create an atmosphere conducive to learning and are fully equipped with modern audio-visual facilities for conducting webinars, online lectures etc. The conferencing needs are taken care of by centrally air-conditioned conference halls fitted with the latest technology to facilitate quality industry-academia interface. A well-equipped cafeteria, gym and aesthetically-furnished guest houses are part of the modern campus.

Central Computing Facility

The teaching pedagogy includes classroom lectures, presentations, field visits, projects, online teaching methods etc. The Computer Centre is equipped with all contemporary facilities to cater to the needs of the teaching as well as research activities of the institute. The use of modern technology provides a competitive edge to the institute in its core areas of education and research. The high quality bandwidth offers speed and uninterrupted internet connectivity from anywhere on the campus through the LAN and Wi-Fi facility.

The Institute employs the latest computing facility and audio-visual aids with technically competent software and hardware professionals to support the infrastructure. The Computer Centre acts as a central nervous system to ensure uninterrupted operations all over the campus. A video conferencing facility installation is under progress to network with peer institutions in India and abroad.

Library

The library has a rich collection of national and international journals and books related to Health Management, Management of Healthcare - Information Technology, Hospital Management, Education, Women Empowerment, Leadership, Management Information Systems, Quality Assurance, Health Economics and Finance, Public Health Management, Population Sciences, Research Methodology, Biostatistics, Sociology, Economics, Computer Science & Information Technology, Pharmacovigilance and Clinical Research, Health Insurance, Project Management etc. besides a sizeable collection of case studies and reports. The library also includes audio and video cassettes, CD-ROMs and e-databases.

Postgraduate Programme

The Institute offers a two-year full-time Postgraduate Programme with specialisation in Hospital Management, Health Management and Healthcare IT Management, with a total annual intake of 120 students.

It is a flagship educational programme which aims to develop trained professional managers with requisite skills in planning, implementation, operational management, diagnosing and problem solving, consultancy and entrepreneurship with a view to prepare them to manage hospitals and healthcare institutions in developing countries, both in the public and the private sectors, and to meet the rising demand for quality healthcare management.

The Institute builds achievers through the program. Our students have won prizes in many inter-campus and national competitions in academic and non-academic activities. They have presented papers in many conferences and have even published their papers, won prestigious international scholarships, featured in the Limca Book of Records and won Citizen Journalist Award by Network 18. The Institute also encourages and supports entrepreneurship and one of our student started an NGO, which has been competitively getting funds and winning laurels for its work.



Course Structure

The Programme follows a semester pattern spread over two years. The first year is common to all students covering Core courses. In the first year in addition to the Core Courses, students are required to attend induction courses (non-graded courses) that provide basic skills. The second year has specialized courses in Health Management, Hospital Management in Management of Healthcare IT.

First Year

During the first year, the programme aims at cultivating multi-disciplinary skills of health systems, management principles and communication which are common to all the streams.

Summer Training

Summer training is an integral part of the programme. The students are placed for eight weeks in various designated hospitals and healthcare organisations for practical exposure and hands-on training. They are assessed on the basis of their performance during this period.

Electives

Electives are offered depending on current Industry needs, students' requirements and Faculty's interest which could cover subjects like HRM Strategy in Hospitals, Financial Strategy in Hospitals, Social Marketing Management, Hospital Economics.....

Second Year

Term VI

Dissertation

All students are required to write a thesis in their area of interest. The thesis will include a critical review of literature pertaining to the specific area of interest, data collection, and analysis of the selected problem, besides other components. The thesis must be completed in the second year.



Evaluation Process

Evaluation of performance is a continuous process at IIHMR. To be recommended for the award of the diploma, the candidates are required to achieve a prescribed standard in the total course work, including both mid-term and the final written examination.

The grades*, grade points and equivalent percentages are as follows:

Grade point average is calculated to two decimal points.

* Induction courses are not considered for grade point average but passing the examination is mandatory for all students.

Award of Diploma

The following are the criteria for passing the examination and award of the Diploma of PGDHM:

Attendance:

Every student is expected to attend all the classes (not less than 75% in any case). No unauthorized absence from field placement is permitted. In exceptional circumstances Course Coordinator may permit leave of absence with prior permission of the Dean.

Examination:

A student's performance will be judged in the mid-term and end-term examinations. Every course carries a maximum of 100 marks. The mid-term exam includes assignments, class participation and written exams, whereas the end-term includes written exams. To clear a course every student has to score a minimum of 50% marks. For further details, please consult academic guidelines.

Summer Training:

Summer training is an integral part of the course. The students are also assessed on the basis of their performance during this period.

Research (Dissertation and Internship):

Every student is required to write a dissertation and an internship report. The students are also assessed on the basis of their performance during this period.

Alumni

On completion of the program, students become part of a network of alumni. An alumni newsletter, provides information on the current program activities. An alumni reunion event is held at the Institute at regular intervals.



Placement

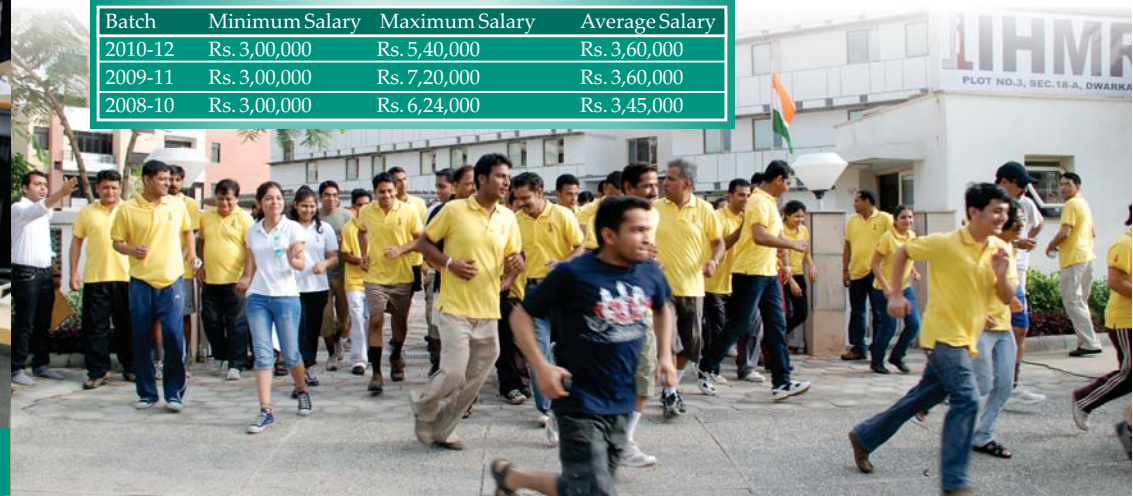

Admission Requirements

Application Form

Candidates aspiring for admission to the PGDHM program are required to fill in an application form, which can be obtained from the Institute by paying Rs. 1000/- in cash or by sending a demand draft for Rs. 1,000/- drawn in favour of "Institute of Health Management Research", payable at Jaipur. Application forms can also be downloaded from our website: www.ihmr.org. In the latter case, applications must be sent along with a DD for Rs. 1,000/- .

Eligibility Requirements

For Fresh Graduates

- 50% marks in the aggregate in the Bachelor's Degree exam in MBBS/BDS/AYUSH/ Graduates in Paramedical/Nursing/Engineering/Science/Arts/Commerce/Economics/ Humanities/Law and Management from a recognized university and with MAT/CMAT/CAT.
- Should have taken any one of the MATs to be conducted by AIMA on September and December 2011, February and May 2012 or CMAT conducted by AICTE or CAT.
- Candidates appearing at the final year examination of the Bachelor's degree or waiting for the results of their final year degree examinations in 2012 may also apply. Such candidates, if selected, will be given provisional admission. They will be required to produce evidence of their graduation within two months of the start of the session.

For Working Executives

- 50% marks in the aggregate in the Bachelor's Degree exam in MBBS/BDS/AYUSH/ Graduates in Paramedical/Nursing/Engineering/Science/Arts/Commerce/Economics/ Humanities/Law and Management from a recognized university.
- Minimum of two years' relevant work experience in the healthcare and/or allied sector.
- Such candidates are exempted from the MAT /CMAT/CAT

Selection Procedure

The eligible candidates will be invited for Group Discussion and Interview. The final selection of the candidate is based on his/her performance in the qualifying examination with proportional score in MAT/CMAT/RMAT/CAT, work experience, group discussion and interview. The distribution of marks for selection will be as follows:

Duly completed application forms may be sent by post along with the application fee and all the documents in support of eligibility. An application will be considered only when it is received with all documentary evidences and the application fee. The application fee is non-refundable.

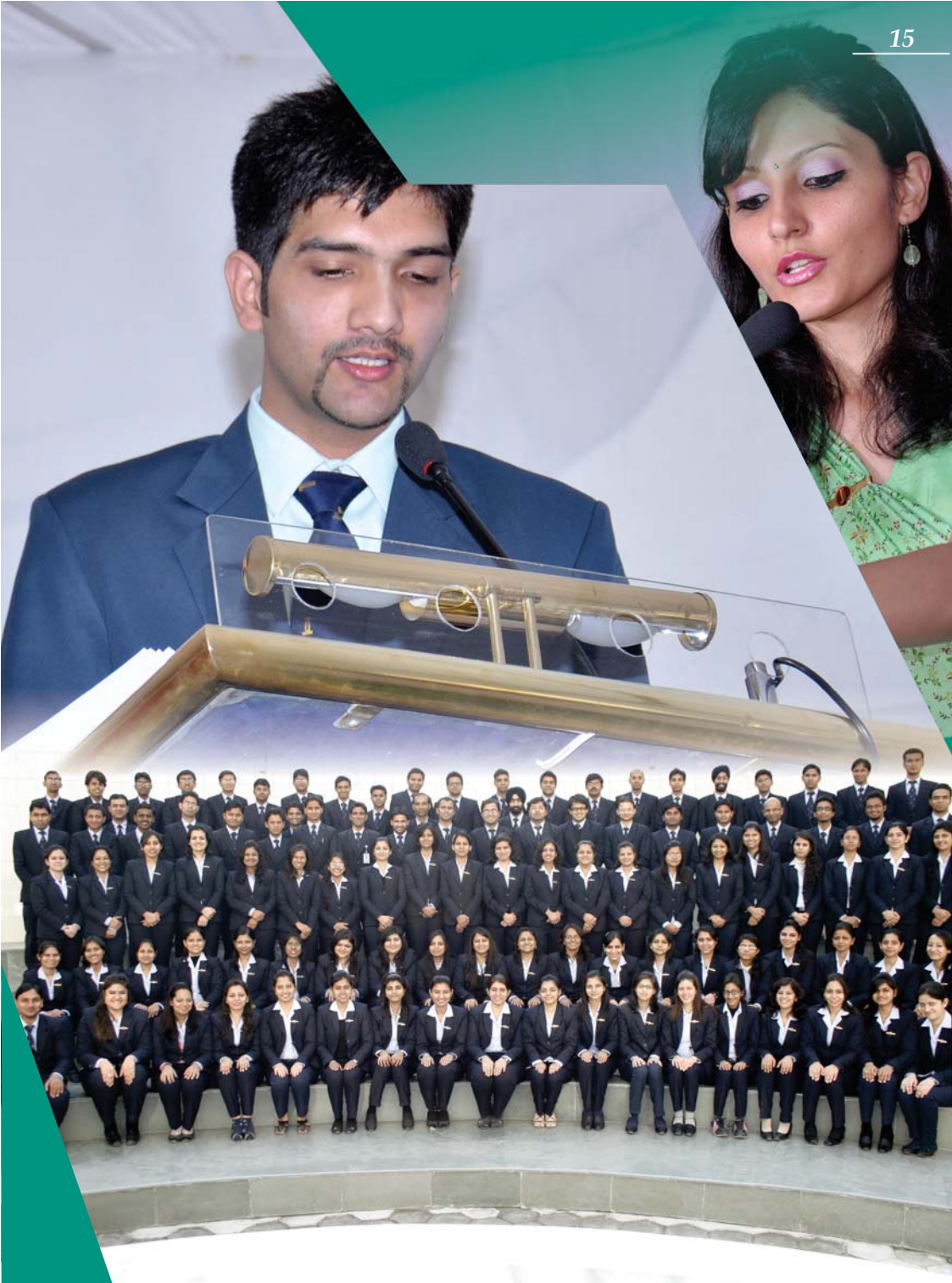
Assistance for Educational Loan

Assistance is provided by the Institute to enable students to access bank loan on a case to case basis.

Fee Refund

In case, a student/candidate withdraws before the starting of the academic session, the Institute will deduct Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand) and shall return the remaining fees deposited by the candidate. If the student/candidate leaves the course after joining, the Institute will return the fee collected with proportionate deduction of tuition/hostel fee as per norms.





Accommodation

Suitable and economical accommodation is available within walking distance of the Institute, Metro rail services and the market, with all support and domestic facilities. Students normally utilize these accommodation on sharing basis. The Institute facilitate students in this aspects.

Scholarship

The Institute may offer scholarships on merit cum need basis to deserving candidates.

World AIDS day was commemorated with visitors from Global HIV/ AIDS Alliance and Jacksonville State University, USA.

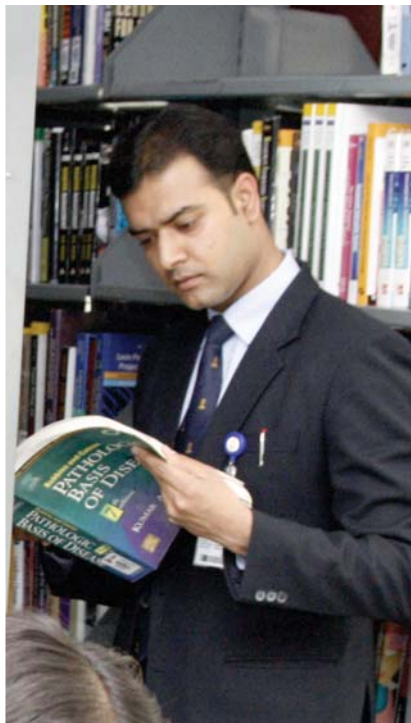
An adventure trip to Jim Corbett National Park and Nainital was organised to raise awareness about wild life and environmental issues amongst students.

Research

Research is one of the core activities of the Institute.
